#### **Legislative Update**

#### **New Law Protecting Pregnant Workers Takes Effect**

Last Tuesday, a new law ensuring reasonable accommodations and employment protections for pregnant and postpartum workers went into effect. The Pregnant Workers Fairness Act passed with overwhelming bipartisan support in December 2022, creating a federal accommodations standard to protect the health of pregnant and postpartum workers. #### **USDA Releases New Data on SNAP Administration**

On Friday, USDA resumed releasing <u>data</u> on State SNAP Administration, showing an increase in rates of over- and underpayment of benefits since data was last reported in 2020. Notably, this data includes error rates resulting from pandemic-era SNAP flexibilities, a byproduct of the strain on state administering agencies working to meet unprecedented demand for nutrition assistance despite limited program bandwidth. The flexibilities that may have contributed to higher error rates in SNAP payments have since been phased out at the conclusion of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, but many state agencies are experiencing continued administration challenges, including low staffing. Some anti-hunger advocates have <u>expressed</u> <u>concern</u> that data on administration errors will be falsely conflated with program fraud—a separate and distinct issue—and lead to unwarranted scrutiny in the ongoing Farm Bill process, at the expense of emphasizing SNAP's success in supporting families.

- Complementary virtual NWA conference registration

"From a grandmother's perspective, I am dedicated to promoting knowledge and respect for the Native wisdom and experience from within our communities by utilizing the seven-generation principles in our everyday lives." Participants have an opportunity to develop an understanding of how the historical experience of American Indians and Alaska Natives connects to Intergenerational Trauma, ongoing discrimination, racism, lateral violence, and Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE). They will learn how experiences over a life course and over generations have a significant impact on our health through the life course. We will explore the link between ACE and early childhood brain development and how adversity early in life increases physical, mental, and behavioral problems later in life. They will also gain knowledge about affirming generational strengths that provide a path to healing and ability to face contemporary challenges through the understanding of Seven Generation Principles. We will explore the role that culture, and traditions play in maintaining balance of physical, social, emotional, and spiritual health and well-being.
